- Tear-off sheets that can be placed inside shopping bags at the point of purchase.
- Adhesive sheets that can be attached to pizza boxes and other take-out containers.

2020 challenged everyone, especially victims of domestic violence. Covid-19 provided another calculated excuse for abusers to isolate and control their vulnerable victims.

Despite the pandemic, Safe Journey remains open to provide free services to those innocent victims and their children. We are the only agency that offers full services for victims in rural Erie County. We do what we can to help victims.

There is good news. The pandemic has driven us to expand our outreach by using technology.

PurpleOne domestic violence awareness trainings now are held virtually via Zoom. We've also added online counseling that allows victims to communicate virtually with our counselor advocates. An online chat option is available, too. We also developed a TV commercial, radio spots, billboards, flyers, EMTA bus ads, and videos on social media to reach out to victims.

A pandemic may come once in a lifetime, but domestic violence is a plague that infects society every minute of every day. We are dedicated to making 2021 a healthier, safer year for all victims.

PurpleOne domestic violence awareness training.

Safe Journey will hold a PurpleOne domestic violence awareness training on Wednesday, Feb. 17th, from noon to 4:30 p.m. The training will be held virtually via Zoom.

PurpleOne educates individuals on how to recognize and respond to domestic violence and how to refer victims to Safe Journey's free and confidential services. The training also teaches participants how to safely become prosocial bystanders in case they encounter a scene of possible domestic violence in a public setting.

Businesses, organizations, and agencies with at least one PurpleOne-trained individual on staff are eligible for certification as a PurpleOne Safe Place, where victims of domestic violence can obtain information about Safe Journey's services. Certified locations display a PurpleOne Safe Place Dot.

Since February 2019 about 370 individuals have been trained, with about 70 locations certified as Safe Places. Register for the Feb. 17 PurpleOne training at PurpleOne.org.
